Key Themes

- Broadening participation...of key developing countries
 - “Scaling up” low carbon investments through enhanced market ‘crediting mechanisms’
 - and ‘missing sectors’ (intl aviation and marine)
- Addressing competitiveness concerns
 - Especially of emissions-intensive commodity sectors in industrialised countries... (carve out model?)
- Targeting key sectors
- A bottom up (and voluntary?) approach
- Differentiation of economy wide targets based on sectoral circumstances

Key Initiatives

- Sector ‘no lose’ targets for developing countries
 - CCAP, Ecofys/GtripleC
 - ‘Lite’ version is sectoral CDM
- Transnational (Industry) sectoral agreements
 - Especially of emissions-intensive commodity sectors in industrialised countries (cement, iron/steel, aluminium)
 - International aviation and marine
- Asia Pacific Partnership (AP7)
- Major Economies Meetings (MEM)
- Japan ‘sectoral approach’ proposal (through G8, AWG-KP, MEM, CCAP FAD, diplomatic posts, ‘etc’)

Prospects

- Sector ‘no lose’ targets for developing countries
 - Gaining traction, but not panacea and not all key sectors or all developing countries. Some serious ‘readiness’ issues to address.
- Transnational (Industry) sectoral agreements
 - Especially of emissions-intensive commodity sectors in industrialised countries (cement, iron/steel, aluminium)
 - ?? Developing countries ‘pushing back’; IC’s gain, DC’s lose
 - International aviation and marine
 - ? How to assemble a negotiation?
- Asia Pacific Partnership (AP7)
 - ?? Show me the money!
- Japan ‘sectoral approach’ proposal
 - ??? Knocked down before understood? Japan gains, who loses?
